

Connecticut Sex Crimes Statistics (Convictions 2015-2019)

Issue

Summarize Connecticut sex crimes convictions from 2015–2019, distinguishing crimes where the statute specifically protects minor victims.

Summary

This report summarizes case outcomes in Connecticut for offenders convicted of criminal offenses involving sexual misconduct ("sex crimes") over the last five years using Judicial Branch data, including the:

- 1. total convictions for each calendar year,
- 2. aggregate number of convictions where the offender received actual jail time,
- 3. aggregate number of convictions where the offender received probation, and
- 4. range of the sentences.

The report also distinguishes convictions for sex crimes where the statute specifically protects minor victims by specifying the victim's age.

There was a total of 2,651 sex crime convictions in Connecticut from 2015 through 2019, representing approximately 1,896 offenders (a single offender may receive multiple convictions, depending on the nature of the crime).

Calendar year 2016 had the highest number of convictions (609), while 2018 had the lowest (456). Of the total 2,651 convictions, 1,461 (55.1%) were for crimes that specifically categorize the victim as a minor or otherwise account for the victim's age; while 1,190 (44.9%) were for other sex crimes.

For the sex crimes that specify the minor victim's age, approximately 92.5% of the convictions had a sentence of actual jail time and 59.1% had a sentence that included at least probation. For the other sex crimes, approximately 56.6% of the convictions had a sentence of actual jail time and 50.8% had a sentence that included at least probation.

The actual jail time shown in this report reflects the portion of any jail sentence that was not suspended. For example, if an offender received a sentence of 5 years in prison suspended after 2 years, the actual jail time is 2 years.

Sex Crime Convictions by Year, 2015–2019

Sex offender convictions has averaged approximately 530 a year for the last five years. Total convictions peaked at 609 in 2016 then fell to a low of 456 in 2018. However, in 2019 it increased to 523, closer to the average for the five-year period. The year over year trends are generally similar. Chart 1 shows the total sex offender convictions for each calendar year for sex crimes where the victim age is not specified, those where the crime specifies the victim as a minor, and the combined total.

Sex Crime Convictions – Victim not Specified as a Minor

Table 1 lists the sex crimes for which the victim's age is not specified and includes the number of convictions per crime for each of the last five years.

As the table above shows, 4th degree sexual assault had the highest number of convictions each year followed by prostitution, 3rd degree sexual assault, and 1st degree sexual assault. Almost 75% of all convictions under this section were for these four crimes.

Patronizing a prostitute from a motor vehicle, had the lowest number of convictions for the time period, however that crime was repealed effective October 1, 2017.

Sex Crime Convictions – Victim Specified as a Minor

Table 2 lists the sex crimes for which the statute specifies the minor victim's age. It also shows the number of convictions for each of these crimes for each of the last five years.

As the table above shows, illegal sexual contact with a child was the crime with the most convictions each year from 2015 through 2019 and accounted for 35.1% of the total convictions for the five-year period. Second degree sexual assault of a minor had the second highest number of convictions every year, making up 17.7% of the total convictions for these crimes. Convictions for 4th degree sexual assault of a minor was the third highest, 13.9% of the total convictions for these crimes for the five-year period.

Additionally, convictions for the top four sex crimes in which the minor victim's age is specified – illegal sexual conduct with a child, 2nd degree sexual assault, 4th degree sexual assault, and 1st degree sexual assault – represent over 75% of all convictions under this section.

Sex Crime Sentences

This report also provides aggregate data for the sentences for the sex crime convictions, including the number with actual jail time and range of the time period received. In this report, actual jail time accounts for the portion of the prison sentence that was not suspended. Some offenders received a prison sentence with no time suspended, others received probation only (i.e., no prison sentence included or a prison sentence that was fully suspended), and some received a split sentence (i.e., prison sentence suspended after a specified time period). Many received a sentence that included jail time as well as a period of probation to be served upon release from prison. According to the Judicial Branch, the actual time spent in jail for any given offender varies based on individual circumstances, including whether there are charges for other crimes, and any consecutive or concurrent designation that impacts overall jail time.

Some offenders also received "special parole," which a judge imposes as part of a criminal sentence. This means the offender serves a period of special parole under parole supervision after he or she completes the prison sentence. Of the 2,024 aggregate convictions with a sentence of actual jail time, approximately 17.5% (354) also had a sentence of special parole generally ranging from one year to 18 years.

Sex Crime Sentences – Victim not Specified as a Minor in Statute

Of the convictions for sex crimes that do not specify that the victim is a minor, Table 3 shows the aggregate number that had a sentence that included actual jail time, the number with a sentence that included probation, and the range of the sentences.

As the table above shows, of the 1,190 convictions for these crimes, 56.6% (673) had a sentence of actual jail time generally ranging from 15 days to 25 years. Slightly over half (50.8%, 604 total) had a sentence that included at least a probation period, generally ranging from two months to 35 years. Of the 673 convictions where the sentence included actual jail time, 78 (11.6%) of them also included a special parole sentence to be served after the jail time has been completed.

Sex Crime Sentences – Minor Victim

For crimes that specifically categorize the victim as a minor, Table 4 shows the aggregate number of convictions that had a sentence of actual jail time, the number with sentences that included probation, and the range of the sentences.

As the table above shows, of the 1,461 convictions for these crimes, 92.5% (1,351) had a sentence that included actual jail time, generally ranging from 1 day to 25 years. Over half (59.1%, 863) had sentences that included probation, generally ranging from two to 35 years. Of the 1351 sex convictions with a sentence of actual jail time, 276 (20.4%) of them also included special parole.
