

# **Municipal Tree Removal Legislation**

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#### Issue

Identify recent Connecticut legislation directing funds to municipalities for hazardous tree removal.

### Summary

Connecticut legislators introduced a number of bills in 2019 and 2020 to direct funds to municipalities for removal of hazardous trees, often caused by gypsy moth or emerald ash borer infestations. The legislature enacted <u>PA 20-1</u>, the annual bond bill, part of which expands the purposes of local capital improvement project (LoCIP) funding to include certain municipal hazardous tree removal or trimming.

## **Municipal Tree Removal Legislation**

Since 2019, Connecticut legislators considered at least nine bills to assist municipalities with the costs of hazardous tree removal. Table 1 identifies these bills and their last action.

Of the nine bills, the legislature enacted one that became law as <u>PA 20-1</u>. Section 55, effective March 12, 2020, expands the list of projects eligible for LoCIP funding to include hazardous tree removal or trimming for non-utility related hazardous branches, limbs, and trees on municipal property or in a municipal right-of-way. LoCIP, administered by the Office of Policy and Management, reimburses municipalities for the cost of eligible local capital improvement projects, such as road, bridge, and public building construction activities.
