

# Department of Consumer Protection Gaming Duties and Authority

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### Issue

Identify the state's gaming statutes that impose duties on or provide regulatory authority to the Department of Consumer Protection (DCP).

## Summary

State law generally permits a state lottery; off-track betting (OTB) and parimutuel gaming (i.e., horse and greyhound racing and jai alai); sports wagering and fantasy contests; charitable gaming (bingo, sealed tickets, and bazaars and raffles); and sweepstakes. In addition, the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan tribes operate the Foxwoods and Mohegan Sun casinos, respectively, on their reservations through a confluence of federal, state, and contract law.

DCP is responsible for implementing or administering most of the laws concerning these permitted forms of gaming, except the state lottery is operated by the Connecticut Lottery Corporation (CLC) and charitable gaming is generally overseen by the municipality where the games are conducted. The department's duties generally include issuing licenses and permits to individuals and entities involved in legalized gaming and monitoring and ensuring compliance with the laws and tribal-state agreements. DCP is the successor agency to the Division of Special Revenue and Gaming Policy Board and has a dedicated <u>Gaming Division</u>.

Table 1 numerically lists the relevant gaming statutes and briefly identifies the main subjects under each of them.
