

Issue Brief Roberta B. Willis Scholarship Program

The Roberta B. Willis Scholarship Program

The Roberta B. Willis Scholarship Program is the only state-funded scholarship available to Connecticut residents who attend an instate public or private higher education institution (excluding the regional-community technical colleges). It consists of three types of awards: need-merit, need-based, and Charter Oak grants (CGS § 10a-173, as amended by PA 23-204, § 135, and PA 23-208, § 11).

State Allocations for the Willis Scholarship Program

The General Assembly allocates funds to the Office of Higher Education (OHE) for the program. OHE keeps some funds to use for need-merit awards and allocates other funds to higher education institutions to distribute for need-based awards and the Charter Oak grant. Table 1 provides the budgeted amounts for the last six fiscal years, along with the percent change from year to year.

For FY 24, OHE must use funds appropriated or allocated for the program to (1) make its awards for the need-based grant and (2) allocate funds for the 2023-24 and 2024-25 academic years for the need-based and Charter Oak grants, so long as it uses all American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds allocated for the program by December 31, 2024 (PA 23-208, § 11).

Need-Based Award

Eligibility

The need-based award is available to state residents who are enrolled full- or part-time at public or independent nonprofit four-year Connecticut colleges and universities. Students must have an Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) equal to or below 200% of the maximum EFC eligible for a federal Pell Grant one year prior to the grant year. Beginning July 1, 2024, PA 23-208, § 11, requires OHE to make eligibility determinations based instead on "student aid index" (SAI) to reflect changes in federal law.

Award Distribution

Unlike the need-merit award, the need-based award is distributed by the institutions themselves rather than OHE. The law allows OHE to reserve up to 80% of the entire state appropriation for the Willis Scholarship Program to be used for need-based awards. OHE has a formula for allocating state funds to the institutions so that they can award these grants in students' financial aid packages. The institutions then follow a formula for determining awards for individual students.

Need-Merit Award

Eligibility

The need-merit award is available to state residents who are enrolled full- or part-time as an undergraduate student at any four-year Connecticut public or independent college or university. OHE makes the need determination based on the expected family contribution for educational costs as computed from the student's Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the merit determination based on high school academic achievement or SAT performance. Awards are renewable with satisfactory academic progress and continuing need (<u>CGS § 10a-173</u>, as amended by <u>PA 23-208</u>, § 11).

Award Distribution

OHE awards the need-merit award directly to student applicants. The law requires OHE to reserve for need-merit awards either (1) at least 20%, but no more than 30%, of the entire state appropriation for the Willis Scholarship Program or (2) \$10 million, whichever is greater. Awards are made on a sliding scale up to a maximum federal EFC set annually by OHE and based on funding levels and the number of eligible applicants. Under <u>PA 23-208</u>, § 11, OHE can also use SAI when making need-merit awards.

Charter Oak Grant

Eligibility

This grant is available to any full- or part-time undergraduate student enrolled in a degree program at Charter Oak State College. Eligible students must demonstrate substantial financial need.

Award Distribution

The law requires OHE to reserve at least \$100,000 from the entire state appropriation for the Willis Scholarship Program for the Charter Oak grant. This grant is funded through need-based grant distributions to Charter Oak State College. Individual awards cannot exceed a student's calculated educational costs (CGS § 10a-173, as amended by PA 23-208, § 11).
