We found 14 chapters of JROTC programs in Connecticut public high schools, as confirmed by the Connecticut Military Department. The respective branches of the U.S. Military approve these programs and the costs are shared between the federal government and the local school districts.

Establishing a JROTC Chapter

JROTC chapters are established under the authority of the respective branch of the U.S. armed forces. High school officials complete and submit an application for a chapter to either the Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marines. (The Connecticut Military Department does not have a formal or statutory role related to JROTC, but it can advocate for JROTC applications that Connecticut school districts submit.)
