The Committee on Housing reported through REP. FELIPE of the 130th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING HOUSING AND THE NEEDS OF HOMELESS PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (Effective from passage) The Commissioner of Housing shall 1 2 conduct a study on initiatives to lower housing costs, increase housing 3 options and better support persons experiencing homelessness in the state. Not later than January 1, 2026, the commissioner shall report the 4 5 results of the study, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a 6 of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing. Such report 7 8 may include the commissioner's recommendations for legislation 9 regarding lowering housing costs, increasing housing options and better supporting persons experiencing homelessness in the state. 10

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
