Substitute House Bill No. 5074

House of Representatives, March 25, 2025

The Committee on Veterans' and Military Affairs reported through REP. FOSTER of the 57th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING A MOTOR VEHICLE NUMBER PLATE COMMEMORATING CONNECTICUT WOMEN VETERANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 14-20b of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2025*):

3 (a) (1) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, at the request of any
4 veteran or member of the armed forces or the surviving spouse of such
5 veteran or member, shall register any motor vehicle owned or leased for
6 a period of at least one year by such person and shall issue a special
7 certificate of registration and a set of number plates commemorating
8 such veteran's or member's military service for each such motor vehicle,
9 including a special certificate of registration and a set of number plates
10 for any motor vehicle used exclusively for farming purposes by any
11 such veteran or member of the armed forces, or the surviving spouse of
12 such veteran or member, who is engaged in agricultural production as
13 a trade or business.

14 (2) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, at the request of any woman
15 veteran or woman member of the armed forces, shall register any motor
16 vehicle owned or leased for a period of at least one year by such person
17 and shall issue a special certificate of registration and a set of number
18 plates commemorating such woman veteran's or woman member's
19 military service for each such motor vehicle, including a special
20 certificate of registration and a set of number plates for any motor
21 vehicle used exclusively for farming purposes by any such woman
22 veteran or woman member of the armed forces who is engaged in
23 agricultural production as a trade or business.

24 (3) The plates provided for under this subsection shall expire and be
25 renewed as provided in section 14-22. The commissioner shall charge a
26 fee for such plates, which fee shall cover the entire cost of making such
27 plates and shall be in addition to the fee for registration of such motor
28 vehicle. The commissioner shall charge a fee of fifteen dollars to replace
29 such plates that become mutilated or illegible. Any such member of the
30 armed forces who is dishonorably discharged shall return such plates to
31 the commissioner not later than thirty days after such discharge. The
32 commissioner shall not renew such plates for any motor vehicle owned
33 or leased by any such member of the armed forces who is dishonorably
34 discharged.

35 (b) (1) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, at the request of any
36 person who was a member of the Hmong Laotian special guerilla units,
37 which units served in the United States secret war in the Kingdom of
38 Laos during the Vietnam War, or any person who is an eligible former
39 reservist, or the surviving spouse of any such person, and after
40 verification from the Department of Veterans Affairs as provided under
41 subdivision (2) or (3) [as applicable,] of this subsection, as applicable,
42 shall register any motor vehicle owned or leased for a period of at least
43 one year by such person and shall issue a special certificate of
44 registration and a set of number plates commemorating such person's
45 military service for each such motor vehicle, including a special
46 certificate of registration and a set of number plates for any motor
47 vehicle used exclusively for farming purposes by any such person, or

48 the surviving spouse of such person, who is engaged in agricultural
49 production as a trade or business. The plates shall expire and be
50 renewed as provided in section 14-22. The commissioner shall charge a
51 fee for such plates, which fee shall cover the entire cost of making such
52 plates and shall be in addition to the fee for registration of such motor
53 vehicle.

54 (2) Any person who was a member of the Hmong Laotian special
55 guerilla units, or the surviving spouse of such person, may submit a
56 request to the Department of Veterans Affairs to be listed as a veteran,
57 based on such person's service during the Vietnam War, for the purpose
58 of obtaining a special certificate of registration and a set of number
59 plates under subdivision (1) of this subsection. Such person, or the
60 surviving spouse of such person, shall provide to said department (A)
61 an affidavit stating (i) when such person served, (ii) where such person
62 served, (iii) the unit in which such person served, and (iv) the capacity
63 in which such person served; (B) any available corroborating witness
64 affidavits; (C) any available official documentation of service; and (D)
65 any other documents supporting such person's or such surviving
66 spouse's affidavit. Said department shall, not later than thirty days after
67 receipt of such request, verify whether such person was a member of the
68 Hmong Laotian special guerilla units and, if so verified, notify the
69 Commissioner of Motor Vehicles of such request and verification.

70 (3) (A) Any person who is an eligible former reservist, or the
71 surviving spouse of such person, may submit a request to the
72 Department of Veterans Affairs to be listed as a veteran, based on such
73 person's service in a reserve component of the armed forces, for the
74 purpose of obtaining a special certificate of registration and a set of
75 number plates under subdivision (1) of this subsection. Such person, or
76 the surviving spouse of such person, shall provide to said department
77 all available official documentation of such service. Said department
78 shall, not later than thirty days after receipt of such request, verify such
79 person's service and, if so verified, notify the Commissioner of Motor
80 Vehicles of such request and verification.

81 (B) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (1) of this
82 subsection or subparagraph (A) of this subdivision, neither the issuance
83 of such registration and number plates to a person by the Commissioner
84 of Motor Vehicles nor the listing of such person as a veteran by the
85 Commissioner of Veterans Affairs shall constitute proof of such person's
86 eligibility for any other benefit available to veterans.

87 (c) As used in this section, "eligible former reservist" means any
88 person honorably discharged from, released under honorable
89 conditions from or released with an other than honorable discharge
90 based on a qualifying condition from, the United States Army Reserve,
91 Army National Guard, Navy Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, Coast
92 Guard Reserve, Air Force Reserve or Air National Guard; and "veteran",
93 "armed forces" and "qualifying condition" have the same meanings as
94 provided in section 27-103.

Explanation

The bill establishes a commemorative license plate for women veterans and, to the extent such plates are requested, results in minimal fiscal impact to the Department of Motor Vehicles for associated plate costs and fee revenue.

The Out Years

The annualized ongoing fiscal impact identified above would continue into the future subject to the number of plates requested.

COMMEMORATING CONNECTICUT WOMEN VETERANS.*****SUMMARY**

This bill requires the motor vehicles commissioner, at the request of a woman who is a veteran or member of the armed forces, to register a motor vehicle and issue a special certificate of registration and a set of license plates commemorating the woman's service. The bill applies if the motor vehicle is owned or leased by the woman veteran or member for at least one year and includes a motor vehicle used exclusively for farming purposes by a woman veteran or woman member who is engaged in agricultural production as a trade or business.

By law, veterans, armed forces members, or their surviving spouses can request a special registration certificate and license plates under the same circumstances.

The bill also makes various technical changes.

EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2025

BACKGROUND***Definition of a Veteran***

A "veteran" is anyone honorably discharged or released under honorable conditions, or released with an other than honorable (OTH) discharge based on a qualifying condition, from active service in the armed forces (the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Space Force, Air Force, and any of their reserve components, including the Connecticut National Guard when under federal service) (CGS § 27-103).

A qualifying condition is a (1) post-traumatic stress disorder or traumatic brain injury diagnosis by a licensed health care professional at a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs facility; (2) military sexual trauma disclosed to such a health care professional; or (3) determination by the Qualifying Review Board that sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression was more likely than not the primary reason for the OTH discharge (CGS § 27-103).

Related Bills

HB 5787 (File 40), favorably reported by the Veterans' and Military Affairs Committee, allows veterans and members of the armed forces who get a license plate recognizing the Military Order of the Purple Heart to apply for reimbursement of the cost of joining a chapter of the Military Order of the Purple Heart in order to get the license plate.

HB 6724, favorably reported by the Veterans' and Military Affairs Committee, authorizes commemorative license plates in recognition of "The Borinqueneers" (the primarily Puerto Rican members of the 65th Infantry Regiment of the U.S. Army who served with distinction). A portion of the fee for the license plates must be used by Hispanic-American Veterans of Connecticut, Inc. to provide bilingual services and assistance to Connecticut veterans and members of the armed forces.

HB 6734, favorably reported by the Veterans' and Military Affairs Committee, reduces the fee for veterans and armed forces members for certain military-related license plates to the cost to make these plates.
