The Committee on Human Services reported through REP. GILCHREST of the 18th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING STAGGERED TERMS FOR MEMBERS OF THE TWO-GENERATIONAL ADVISORY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 17b-112*l* of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*,
- 3 2025):
- 4 (d) A Two-Generational Advisory Board shall be established as part
- 5 of the initiative to advise the state, the legislature and the Secretary of
- 6 the Office of Policy and Management on how to foster family economic
- 7 self-sufficiency in low income households through a comprehensive
- 8 two-generational service delivery approach for early child care,
- 9 education and workforce readiness. The board shall work in partnership
- 10 with philanthropic organizations, as available, to provide support,
- 11 technical assistance, guidance and best practices to the participating
- 12 communities in the initiative designated pursuant to subsection (c) of
- 13 this section. The board shall consist of (1) one member of the General
- 14 Assembly appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives,

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15 who shall serve as a cochairperson; (2) one member of the Senate 16 appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate, who shall serve 17 as a cochairperson; (3) one member representing the interests of 18 business or trade organizations appointed by the majority leader of the 19 Senate; (4) one member with expertise on issues concerning physical 20 and mental health appointed by the majority leader of the House of 21 Representatives; (5) one member with expertise on issues concerning 22 children and families appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; (6) 23 one member of the General Assembly appointed by the minority leader 24 of the House of Representatives; (7) one member appointed by the 25 Governor; (8) representatives of nonprofit and philanthropic 26 organizations and scholars who are experts in two-generational 27 programs and policies, including, but not limited to, at least one such 28 representative and scholar with experience in developing strategies to 29 achieve racial equity and social justice, selected by the cochairpersons; 30 (9) parent or family leaders representing low-income households 31 selected by the Commission on Women, Children, Seniors, Equity and 32 Opportunity, who shall constitute one-fourth of the board; and (10) 33 other business and academic professionals as needed to achieve goals 34 for two-generational systems planning, evaluations and outcomes, 35 selected by the cochairpersons. <u>Beginning July 1, 2025, members of the</u> 36 board shall be appointed or reappointed by the appointing authorities 37 to staggered three-year terms, such that not more than one-third of the 38 board members' terms end on the same date. The Chief Court 39 Administrator, or the Chief Court Administrator's designee, shall serve 40 as ex-officio members of the advisory board. The staff of the 41 Commission on Women, Children, Seniors, Equity and Opportunity 42 shall serve as the organizing and administrative staff of the advisory 43 board.

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OLR Bill Analysis HB 5730

AN ACT CONCERNING STAGGERED TERMS FOR MEMBERS OF THE TWO-GENERATIONAL ADVISORY BOARD.

SUMMARY

By law, the Two-Generational Advisory Board advises the state on how to foster family economic self-sufficiency in low-income households through a comprehensive two-generational service delivery approach. The board consists of both appointed and ex-officio members who, under current law, are not subject to term limits. Beginning July 1, 2025, the bill (1) establishes three-year term limits for appointed board members and (2) requires them to be appointed or reappointed by the appointing authorities in a way so that no more than one-third of their terms end on the same date. (The bill does not specify how these term limits and staggering requirements must be implemented.)

Existing law requires the board's membership to include representatives of nonprofit and philanthropic organizations and scholars with expertise in two-generational programs and policies. Current law does not designate an appointing authority for these members. Under the bill, these members must be selected by the board's co-chairpersons.
