House of Representatives, March 27, 2025

The Committee on Planning and Development reported through REP. KAVROS DEGRAW of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE CHARTER OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT OF HARTFORD COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 6 of special act 14-21 is amended to read as follows
 (*Effective October 1, 2025*):

3 The Metropolitan District [Commission] shall annually prepare a 4 report that includes the following: (1) A list of all bond issues for the 5 preceding fiscal year, including, for each such issue, the financial 6 advisor and underwriters, whether the issue was competitive, 7 negotiated or privately placed, and the issue's face value and net 8 proceeds; (2) a list of all projects receiving financial assistance during 9 the preceding fiscal year, including each project's purpose, location, and 10 the amount of funds provided by the district; (3) the cumulative value 11 of all bonds issued, the value of outstanding bonds and capital projects 12 associated with such bonds; (4) as of February 15th of each fiscal year, 13 an accounting showing all water revenue and expenditures by source,

category and type; and (5) the affirmative action policy statement, a 14 15 description of the composition of the district's work force by race, sex, 16 and occupation and a description of the district's affirmative action 17 efforts. The district shall, not later than [January] July first, submit one 18 copy of such report to the Governor, [to] the Auditors of Public 19 Accounts, [and to] the Office of Fiscal Analysis and, [two copies of such 20 report to the Legislative Program Review and Investigations 21 Committee. Not later than thirty days after receiving copies of such 22 report from the district, the Legislative Program Review and 23 Investigations Committee shall prepare an assessment of whether the 24 report complies with the requirements of this section and shall submit 25 the assessment and a copy of the report to] in accordance with the 26 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, the joint standing 27 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters 28 relating to municipalities.

Sec. 2. Section 1 of number 294 of the special acts of 1933 is amended
to read as follows (*Effective October 1, 2025*):

31 Any town [which is contiguous to the metropolitan district] may, 32 subject to the provisions of any relevant special act or municipal charter, 33 ordinance or regulation, after receiving the formal approval of the 34 district board, become incorporated [in said district] into The 35 <u>Metropolitan District</u> substantially in the same manner as provided in 36 section ninety-six, sub-section (e), of an act creating a metropolitan 37 district within the county of Hartford, approved May 13, 1929. Each 38 such town, upon its incorporation into said district, shall be entitled to 39 be represented upon said district board by one member of the first form, 40 to be appointed by the governor in accordance with the provisions of 41 said sub-section and to hold office until his successor shall be appointed 42 and shall have qualified.

43 Sec. 3. Number 173 of the special acts of 1939 is amended to read as
44 follows (*Effective October 1, 2025*):

The district board of [the] The Metropolitan District is authorized, before approving the incorporation into said district of any town

47 contiguous thereto, to agree with such town as to the terms of such 48 incorporation, which terms may include the fixing of a temporary 49 service charge to be collected with and in addition to the uniform water 50 rates for a stated period. After the expiration of such period, the water 51 rates current in such town shall be uniform with the rates in the rest of 52 said district. Nothing herein contained shall affect the admission into 53 said district of the town of West Hartford as heretofore provided by law.
