Substitute House Bill No. 7053

House of Representatives, April 2, 2025

The Committee on Public Safety and Security reported through REP. BOYD of the 50th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP
UNIFORM STATUTORY DEFINITIONS OF "FIRST RESPONDER" AND
"ESSENTIAL WORKER".***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a working
2 group to develop uniform statutory definitions of the terms "first
3 responder" and "essential worker".

4 (b) The working group shall consist of the following members:

5 (1) Any persons appointed by the chairpersons and ranking members
6 of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
7 cognizance of matters relating to public safety and security who the
8 chairpersons and ranking members determine may serve as sources of
9 information and data to accomplish the purposes of the working group;

10 (2) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection,
11 or the commissioner's designee;

- 12 (3) The Labor Commissioner, or the commissioner's designee;
- 13 (4) The Commissioner of Public Health, or the commissioner's
14 designee; and
- 15 (5) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, or the
16 secretary's designee.
- 17 (c) Any member of the working group appointed under subdivision
18 (1) of subsection (b) of this section may be a member of the General
19 Assembly.
- 20 (d) All initial appointments to the working group shall be made not
21 later than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy
22 shall be filled by the appointing authority.
- 23 (e) The chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the General
24 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public safety and
25 security shall select the chairpersons of the working group from among
26 the members of the working group. Such chairpersons of the working
27 group shall schedule the first meeting of the working group, which shall
28 be held not later than sixty days after the effective date of this section.
- 29 (f) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the
30 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public safety
31 and security shall serve as administrative staff of the working group.
- 32 (g) Not later than January 1, 2026, the working group shall submit a
33 report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
34 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
35 relating to public safety and security, in accordance with the provisions
36 of section 11-4a of the general statutes. The working group shall
37 terminate on the date that it submits such report or January 1, 2026,
38 whichever is later.

<p>This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:</p>

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Statement of Legislative Commissioners:

In Subsec. (b), the subdivisions were reordered for consistency with standard drafting conventions and Subdiv. (1) was rewritten for clarity; and in Subsec. (c), "(5)" was changed to "(1)" for consistency with the provisions of Subsec. (b).
