The Committee on Environment reported through REP. PARKER of the 101st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING CERTAIN CARETAKER AUTHORIZATION FOR THE AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 22-81 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):
 - (a) Said board shall have the general management of the institution and shall appoint a director, who shall have the general management and oversight of experiments and investigations. It may own such real and personal estate as may be necessary for carrying on its work and may receive title to the same by deed, devise or bequest. The board may assign caretakers to reside in trust-owned properties under the jurisdiction of such board as trustee. Such caretakers may include, but shall not be limited to, Agricultural Experiment Station department heads, employees and the director of the station. It shall expend all money appropriated by the state in the prosecution of the work for which said institution is established, shall use for the same purpose the

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15 income from all funds and endowments which it may receive from other 16 sources and may sue and be sued by the name of the Connecticut 17 Agricultural Experiment Station. It may seek and obtain patents, 18 trademarks and licensing agreements relating to inventions and 19 discoveries of any employee of the Connecticut Agricultural 20 Experiment Station. It may pursue any opportunity to receive funds for 21 research available from the federal government or from private sources. It shall make an annual report to the joint standing committee of the 22 23 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Energy and 24 25 Environmental Protection, including a statement of the activities of the 26 station and the sources and amounts of funds available to the station. It 27 shall make an annual report to the Governor, as provided in section 4-28 60, including therein a report upon adulterated food products and a 29 report of the work done and results obtained under the provisions of 30 section 22-84.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

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OLR Bill Analysis HB 7171

AN ACT CONCERNING CERTAIN CARETAKER AUTHORIZATION FOR THE AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION.

SUMMARY

This bill allows the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station's (CAES) board of control to assign caretakers to live in properties that are under the board's jurisdiction. Under the bill, the caretakers may be the CAES director, department heads, or employees.

By law, the board has general management powers over CAES and may own property as needed to carry out its work.
