Substitute House Resolution No. 9

House of Representatives, April 7, 2025

The House Committee on Commerce reported through REP. MESKERS of the 150th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute resolution ought to be adopted.

### RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO AMEND THE JONES ACT TO EXEMPT THE TRANSPORTATION OF DOMESTIC LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS.

Resolved by this House:

1 WHEREAS, Section 27 of the Merchant Marine Act of 1920, more 2 commonly referred to as the Jones Act, requires that any vessel 3 transporting cargo shipped from one United States port to another be 4 built in the United States, owned by United States citizens, crewed 5 predominately by United States citizens and flagged in the United 6 States;

WHEREAS, Congress enacted the Jones Act to support militaryreadiness and to support the shipbuilding and seafaring industries;

9 WHEREAS, although the Jones Act is well-intentioned, the act has10 had unintended consequences on Connecticut and Puerto Rico;

11 WHEREAS, approximately sixty-five per cent of the electricity 12 generated in Connecticut, and twenty-three per cent of the electricity

13	generated in Puerto Rico, is from natural gas;
14	WHEREAS, there is a shortage of Jones Act-compliant natural gas
15	tanker vessels available to transport liquefied natural gas between
16	United States ports;
17	WHEREAS, the United States is the largest liquefied natural gas
18	exporter in the world, but the Jones Act effectively limits the amount of
19	domestic imports of critical goods such as liquefied natural gas between
20	domestic ports, including Connecticut and Puerto Rico;
21	WHEREAS, the Jones Act has been cited as increasing the cost of
22	liquefied natural gas by as much as thirty per cent;
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Connecticut General
24	Assembly calls upon the Congress of the United States to pass
25	legislation to exempt the transportation of domestic liquefied natural
26	gas between United States ports from the Jones Act; and
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the clerk of the House of
28	Representatives cause a copy of this resolution be sent to each member
20 29	of the Connecticut congressional delegation.
