# AN ACT CONCERNING THE MITIGATION OF EFFECTS ON WILDLIFE AND FISHERIES FROM FUTURE OFFSHORE WIND PROJECTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than October 1, 2026, the 2 Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection shall adopt 3 regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the 4 general statutes, to require any future offshore wind project proposals 5 to: (1) Increase the mitigation measures for offshore wind projects to 6 mitigate adverse consequences to wildlife, birds, marine mammals, 7 fisheries and any other aspects of the fishing industry that result from 8 activities connected with the development and operation of the offshore 9 wind facilities, including workforce development retraining for 10 fishermen adversely impacted by offshore wind operations, (2) require 11 contract commitments that provide for selected bidders to make an 12 initial payment and regular recurring payments into an offshore wind 13 project mitigation fund to mitigate the ongoing adverse consequences 14 that result from activities connected with the development and

operation of offshore wind facilities by such selected bidders and 15 16 prohibit the return of any such mitigation funds to selected bidders, (3) 17 prohibit such bidders from administering any such mitigation funds, and (4) establish an independent mitigation fund oversight committee 18 19 to administer, manage and distribute any such mitigation funds, which 20 shall include payment for ongoing damages suffered by such 21 stakeholders and the environment caused during and after the 22 operational phase of such offshore wind projects.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following<br/>sections:Section 1from passageNew section
