Senate Bill No. 1307

Senate, March 6, 2025

The Committee on Housing reported through SEN. MARX of the 20th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY AND DEVELOP BEST PRACTICES TO PROMOTE HOUSING GROWTH AND PROTECT THE STATE'S WATER SUPPLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a working
2 group to develop best practices to promote housing growth and protect
3 the state's water supply.

4 (b) The working group shall consist of the following members:

5 (1) The chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the General
6 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing;

7 (2) The ranking members of the joint standing committee of the
8 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing, or
9 their designees;

10 (3) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, or the
11 secretary's designee;

- 12 (4) The Commissioner of Housing, or the commissioner's designee;
- 13 (5) The Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection, or
14 the commissioner's designee;
- 15 (6) The Commissioner of Public Health, or the commissioner's
16 designee;
- 17 (7) Two representatives with expertise in housing, appointed by the
18 chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
19 having cognizance of matters relating to housing;
- 20 (8) Two representatives with expertise in state, regional or local
21 planning, appointed by the chairpersons of the joint standing committee
22 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
23 housing; and
- 24 (9) Two representatives with expertise in public water supply,
25 appointed by the chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the
26 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing.
- 27 (c) Any member of the working group appointed under subdivision
28 (1), (2), (7), (8) or (9) of subsection (b) of this section may be a member
29 of the General Assembly.
- 30 (d) All initial appointments to the working group shall be made not
31 later than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy
32 shall be filled by the appointing authority.
- 33 (e) The chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the General
34 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing shall serve
35 as the chairpersons of the working group. Such chairpersons shall
36 schedule the first meeting of the working group, which shall be held not
37 later than sixty days after the effective date of this section.
- 38 (f) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the
39 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing
40 shall serve as the administrative staff of the working group.

41 (g) Not later than January 1, 2026, the working group convened
42 pursuant to this section shall submit a report on its findings to the joint
43 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
44 matters relating to housing, in accordance with the provisions of section
45 11-4a of the general statutes. The working group shall terminate on the
46 date that it submits such report or January 1, 2026, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
