Substitute Senate Bill No. 1317

Senate, March 25, 2025

The Committee on Planning and Development reported through SEN. RAHMAN of the 4th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING LIENS FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE HOUSING CODE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 7-148aa of the general statutes is repealed and the
following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2025*):

3 Any unpaid penalty imposed by a municipality pursuant to the 4 provisions of an ordinance (1) adopted pursuant to section 8-12a, [or] (2) 5 regulating blight, adopted pursuant to subparagraph (H)(xv) of 6 subdivision (7) of subsection (c) of section 7-148, or (3) requiring the 7 maintenance of safe and sanitary housing, adopted pursuant to 8 subparagraph (A)(i) of subdivision (7) of subsection (c) of section 7-148, 9 shall constitute a lien upon the real estate against which the penalty was 10 imposed from the date of such penalty. Each such lien may be 11 continued, recorded and released in the manner provided by the general 12 statutes for continuing, recording and releasing property tax liens. Each 13 such lien shall take precedence over all other liens filed after July 1, 1997,

- 14 and encumbrances except taxes, and may be enforced in the same
- 15 manner as property tax liens.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill makes certain unpaid fines a lien on the affected real estate. This may result in a potential revenue gain to municipalities beginning in FY 26 to the extent that additional liens are issued, and debt is collected.

The Out Years

The annualized ongoing fiscal impact identified above would continue into the future subject to inflation and number of liens issued.

AN ACT CONCERNING LIENS FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE HOUSING CODE.

SUMMARY

By law, municipalities may adopt ordinances establishing fines of up to \$250 for violating local ordinances on maintaining safe and sanitary housing. This bill makes unpaid fines imposed under these municipal ordinances a lien on the affected real estate from the date of the fine, just as existing law provides for unpaid fines for blight and zoning violations. The lien takes precedence over all other liens filed after July 1, 1997, and encumbrances, except taxes. It can be continued, recorded, enforced, and released in the same way as a property tax lien.
