The Committee on Education reported through SEN. MCCRORY, D. of the 2nd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT REQUIRING BOARDS OF EDUCATION TO POST CURRICULUM ONLINE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (e) of section 10-220 of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*,
2025):

4 (e) Each local and regional board of education shall establish a school 5 district curriculum committee. The committee shall recommend, 6 develop, review and approve all curriculum for the local or regional 7 school district. Each local and regional board of education shall (1) make 8 available all curriculum approved by the committee and all associated 9 curriculum materials in accordance with the requirements of the 10 Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment, 20 USC 1232h, and (2) post all 11 approved curriculum on the Internet web site of such board.

Explanation

The bill has no fiscal impact to local or regional school districts. It requires districts to post curriculum information online. It is anticipated that they can meet this requirement with existing resources.

SB 1346

AN ACT REQUIRING BOARDS OF EDUCATION TO POST CURRICULUM ONLINE.

SUMMARY

This bill requires each local and regional board of education to post all of its approved curriculum on the board's website. Current law requires boards to make the curriculum and all associated curriculum materials available in accordance with the federal Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA). PPRA, in part, gives parents and guardians the right to inspect instructional material used by the school district as part of their student's educational curriculum (excluding academic tests and assessments) (20 U.S.C. § 1232h).
