The Committee on Higher Education and Employment Advancement reported through SEN. SLAP of the 5th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE NORWALK CONSERVATORY OF THE ARTS TO CONFER DEGREES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Norwalk Conservatory of the Arts, located in the city of Norwalk, shall have the authority to confer such degrees and grant such diplomas or certificates as are customary in institutions of higher education, in accordance with its bylaws and subject to such requirements as may be prescribed by the Office of Higher Education, in accordance with the provisions of section 10a-34 of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
