Explanation

The bill creates a process for certain occupational licenses to apply to the Department of Consumer Protection to hire additional apprentices resulting in a potential revenue gain to the state to the extent additional occupational licenses are applied for.

Senate "A" strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact resulting in the impact described above.
