REASONS FOR BILL:

There has been a growing concern in the state for increased transparency and accountability in government. The efficiency and costs of how state programs are managed is an area that has received some concerns over increased transparency. With programs and funds being reviewed to audit efficiency, this could provide the opportunity for improvements in these programs to be refined and increase its ability to provide better service. This bill would seek to reestablish the program review for investigations to address these concerns.
