REASONS FOR BILL:

This bill provides a full staff of environmental conservation officers. The conservation officers are necessary for the enforcement of environmental regulations and protection of state wildlife. Without appropriate staffing, certain species and environmental health could not be easily sustained.

RESPONSE FROM ADMINISTRATION/AGENCY:

William Tong, Attorney General

Attorney General William Tong submitted public hearing testimony in support of bill 6250. By increasing the level of environmental conservation staffing, the bill is giving Connecticut more tools to protect its wildlife. More conservation officers offer more enforcing power to laws related to poaching, which William Tong emphasizes is incredibly important to species with decreasing populations, like striped bass.
