REASONS FOR BILL:

This bill would create a special license plate in recognition of "The Borinqueneers", the primarily Puerto Rican Sixty-Fifth Infantry Regiment of the United States Army. Given the unit's underrepresentation in history and their importance to the US Military in the early 20th century, establishing a license plate to commemorate them would give the unit recognition that it has not had for decades.

RESPONSE FROM ADMINISTRATION/AGENCY:

None expressed.

NATURE AND SOURCES OF SUPPORT:

Representative Geraldo Reyes, State Representative, Connecticut General Assembly: Rep. Reyes expressed his support for this bill, explaining their history and their contribution during World Wars I and II and the Korean War – all of this in spite of the discrimination they faced. He noted that the Borinqueneers' legacy lives on through those who remember them, and this bill would provide another way to do so.

<u>Allison Weir, Executive Director, Connecticut Veterans' Legal Center</u>: Ms. Weir expressed her support for this bill, noting that the Borinqueneers served with multiple success in the Korean War. She pointed out that the success of the US Military is largely due to the diversity of its troops, something that should be celebrated and recognized.
