REASONS FOR BILL:

This bill amends current law to waive tuition for any CT resident who lives in a nursing home and who takes any online courses at regional community-technical colleges. Nursing home residents are plagued with feelings of isolation, a lack of meaning or sense of purpose, low levels of participation with their surroundings, and more. This bill aims to address these issues by providing a path toward a better life through education and engagement which stimulates the mind and fosters the building of new relationships.

Connecticut Aging and Disability Services, Ms. Mairead Painter, Long-Term Care Ombudsman: She supports this legislation because it recognizes that quality of life goes beyond physical care. Providing tuition waivers for nursing home residents is a holistic approach to supporting people as they recover or adjust to long-term care.
