REASONS FOR BILL:

Many veterans and servicemembers have noted that despite experiencing increased rates of military sexual trauma, homelessness, and other service-related conditions compared to their male counterparts, women veterans receive very little explicit recognition. To alleviate this lack of commemoration, twenty-one states recognize June 12th, being the anniversary of the signing of the Women's Armed Services Integration Act of 1948, to be Women Veterans Recognition Day. In accordance with these other states, this bill seeks to designate June 12th as Women Veterans Recognition Day.
