REASONS FOR BILL:

This bill requires the Dept. of Social Services and the Dept. of Aging and Disability Services to study long-term care needs in Connecticut and to report to the Aging and Human Services Committees by January 1, 2026.

NATURE AND SOURCES OF SUPPORT:

LeadingAge Connecticut, Ms. Mag Morelli, President: They **support** this bill and offer their assistance to the Committee with this study. They point out that the state's Long-Term Care Planning committee's website and their long-term care plans and reports.

AARP Connecticut, Ms. Natalie Shurtleff, Assoc. State Director of Advocacy and Community Outreach: They support this legislation to better understand the needs of this changing population and the efforts to study the diverse needs of the states aging population as related to transportation and housing.
