REASONS FOR BILL:

Raised Bill SB-1424 seeks to confer the ability of the International Institute for the Astronautical Sciences to bestow degrees.

This bill, like <u>SB-1412</u>: AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE NORWALK CONSERVATORY OF THE ARTS TO CONFER DEGREES, seek to meet the request made by institutions of higher education in Connecticut who, after dually receiving permission from the Office of Higher Education to bestow degrees, must attain an act favorably passed by the Connecticut General Assembly to confirm these decisions.

In the aggregate, this legislation will foster a sense of learning prowess in our state as more institutions may be buoyed by these two institution's successes, if the legislation is passed, and petition the Office of Higher Education for such powers, creating better ability to educate our state's populace in novel ways previously prevented by the lack of this legislation.
