AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MAXIMUM RESTOCKING FEE FOR RETURNED CONSUMER GOODS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2025*) (a) As used in this section:

2 (1) "Business" has the same meaning as provided in section 42-158ff
3 of the general statutes;

4 (2) "Consumer" means an individual who is physically present in this
5 state and is a prospective purchaser or purchaser of consumer goods;
6 and

7 (3) "Consumer good" has the same meaning as provided in section8 42-158ff of the general statutes.

9 (b) No business shall require a consumer to pay any fee or charge in 10 exchange for accepting any consumer good for return to such business's 11 general inventory or regular stock if the amount of such fee or charge 12 exceeds the lesser of (1) the actual cost incurred by the business in 13 returning such consumer good to such business's general inventory or 14 regular stock, or (2) five per cent of the purchase price charged for such 15 consumer good.

16 (c) The Commissioner of Consumer Protection may adopt 17 regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the 18 general statutes, to implement the provisions of this section.

- 19 (d) Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be deemed an
- 20 unfair or deceptive trade practice under subsection (a) of section 42-110b
- 21 of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
