AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECORDING OF A MILITARY DISCHARGE CHARACTERIZATION UPON A STATE VETERANS REGISTRY AS "HONORABLE".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 27-103 of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

4 (d) (1) Any veteran who receives an other than honorable discharge 5 and who believes such discharge characterization was based on such 6 veteran's sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression, may 7 file an application for state-based veterans benefits and to be recorded 8 upon a state veterans registry as having a discharge characterization of 9 "honorable". Such veteran may include evidence supporting his or her 10 claim that such [discharge characterization] other than honorable 11 discharge was based on such veteran's sexual orientation, gender 12 identity or gender expression.

(2) The commissioner shall promulgate a standardized applicationform enumerating the required documentation necessary for filing an

15 application under this subsection and shall make such form available on

the Department of Veterans Affairs' Internet web site along withinstructions for filing the application.

(3) The commissioner shall promulgate a standardized request for reconsideration form enumerating the required documentation necessary for filing a request for reconsideration pursuant to subdivision (5) of this subsection and shall make such form available on the Department of Veterans Affairs' Internet web site along with instructions for filing the request for reconsideration.

24 (4) The board shall review each application submitted and render a 25 recommendation to the commissioner as to whether the veteran's sexual 26 orientation, gender identity or gender expression was more likely than 27 not the primary reason for an other than honorable discharge. The board 28 shall review each application not later than thirty days after receipt and 29 render a written recommendation to the commissioner not later than 30 thirty days after such review. The commissioner shall issue a written 31 decision not later than ten days after receipt of the board's 32 recommendation, approving or denying the application. If the commissioner approves the application, such veteran shall be eligible 33 34 for state-based veterans benefits and shall be recorded upon a state 35 veterans registry as having a discharge characterization of "honorable".

36 (5) A veteran aggrieved by the commissioner's decision may file a 37 request for reconsideration with the commissioner not later than fifteen 38 days after receipt of the commissioner's decision. Such veteran may 39 include supplemental documentation in support of the request for 40 reconsideration. The commissioner shall provide due consideration to 41 the request for reconsideration and render a decision not later than ten 42 days after receipt of such request for reconsideration. The 43 commissioner's decision shall be a final decision by the Department of 44 Veterans Affairs and may be appealed to the Superior Court in 45 accordance with the provisions of section 4-183.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
sections:

Section 1	from passage	27-103(d)

Statement of Purpose:

To allow any person who received an other than honorable discharge and who believes such discharge characterization was based on such person's sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression to apply to have such person's discharge characterization recorded upon a state veterans registry as "honorable".
