AN ACT REDEFINING "INCLUSIONARY ZONING".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 8-2i of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October* 1, 2025):

4 (a) As used in this section, "inclusionary zoning" means any zoning 5 regulation, requirement or condition of development imposed by 6 ordinance, regulation or pursuant to any special permit, special 7 exception or subdivision plan which promotes the development of 8 housing affordable to persons and families of low and moderate income, 9 including, but not limited to, (1) the setting aside of a reasonable number 10 of housing units for long-term retention as affordable housing through 11 deed restrictions or other means; (2) the use of density bonuses; or (3) in 12 lieu of or in addition to such other requirements or conditions, the 13 making of payments into a housing trust fund to be used for <u>acquiring</u>, 14 constructing, rehabilitating or repairing housing affordable to persons 15 and families of low and moderate income, acquiring real property to be 16 used for such housing or incentivizing deed restrictions that preserve 17 real property for use as such housing. "Inclusionary zoning" does not

- 18 include the use of funds from any such housing trust fund to acquire
- 19 real property by eminent domain regardless of the intended use of such
- 20 property.

To redefine "inclusionary zoning" to include the acquisition of property for affordable housing developments.
