AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND DEMENTIA ADVISORY COUNCIL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2025*) (a) There is established,

2 within the Department of Aging and Disability Services, an Alzheimer's

3 Disease and Dementia Advisory Council. The advisory council shall:

(1) Examine (A) the needs of persons living with Alzheimer's disease
or dementia in the state, (B) the services available to such persons and
their family caregivers, and (C) the ability of health care providers and
institutions to meet the needs of such persons; and

8 (2) Develop a State Alzheimer's Plan, which shall make findings and9 recommendations regarding:

(A) State residents living with Alzheimer's disease and dementia and
their service needs, including, but not limited to, (i) the state's role in
providing or facilitating long-term care, family caregiver support and
assistance to persons with early-stage and early-onset Alzheimer's
disease or dementia, (ii) state policies regarding persons living with

Alzheimer's disease or dementia, and (iii) the fiscal impact of
Alzheimer's disease and dementia on publicly funded health care
programs;

18 (B) Existing resources, services and capacity relating to the diagnosis 19 and care of persons living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, 20 including, but not limited to, (i) the type, cost and availability of 21 dementia care services, (ii) the availability of health care providers who 22 can provide Alzheimer's disease or dementia-related services, 23 including, but not limited to, neurologists, geriatricians and direct care 24 workers, (iii) dementia-specific training requirements for public and 25 private employees who interact with persons living with Alzheimer's 26 disease or dementia, including, but not limited to, long-term care 27 providers, case managers, adult protective services employees and law 28 enforcement personnel and other first responders, (iv) home and 29 community-based services, including, but not limited to, respite care 30 services, (v) quality care measures for home and community-based 31 services and residential care facilities, and (vi) state-supported 32 Alzheimer's disease and dementia research conducted at higher 33 education institutions located in the state; and

(C) Policies and strategies that (i) increase public awareness of 34 35 Alzheimer's disease and dementia, (ii) educate health care providers to 36 increase early detection and diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease and 37 dementia, (iii) improve health care services for persons living with 38 Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (iv) evaluate the capacity of the health 39 care system in meeting the growing number and needs of persons living 40 with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (v) increase the number of health 41 care providers available to treat the growing aging population and 42 populations living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (vi) improve 43 services provided in the home and community to delay and decrease 44 the need for institutionalized care for persons living with Alzheimer's 45 disease or dementia, (vii) improve long-term care services, including, 46 but not limited to, assisted living services for persons living with 47 Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (viii) assist unpaid Alzheimer's

48 disease and dementia caregivers, (ix) increase and improve research on 49 Alzheimer's disease and dementia, (x) promote activities to maintain 50 and improve brain health, (xi) improve data and information collection 51 relating to Alzheimer's disease and dementia and the public health 52 burdens associated with such diseases, (xii) improve public safety and 53 address the safety-related needs of persons living with Alzheimer's 54 disease or dementia, (xiii) address legal protections for, and legal issues 55 faced by, persons living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, and (xiv) 56 improve methods through which the state evaluates and adopts policies 57 to assist persons living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia.

58 (b) The advisory council shall consist of the following members:

59 (1) Ten members appointed by the Governor, (A) one of whom shall 60 be a person living with early stage or early onset Alzheimer's disease or 61 dementia, (B) one of whom shall be a family caregiver of a person living 62 with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (C) one of whom shall represent 63 a municipality that provides services to senior citizens, (D) one of whom 64 shall represent home health care agencies, (E) two of whom shall be health care providers with experience diagnosing and treating 65 66 Alzheimer's disease, (F) one of whom shall represent a national 67 organization that advocates on behalf of persons living with 68 Alzheimer's disease or dementia, (G) one of whom shall represent the 69 area agencies on aging, established pursuant to section 17a-850 of the 70 general statutes, (H) one of whom shall represent long-term care 71 facilities, and (I) one of whom shall have expertise in aging policy issues;

(2) The Commissioner of Aging and Disability Services, or thecommissioner's designee;

74 (3) The Commissioner of Public Health, or the commissioner's75 designee;

76 (4) The Commissioner of Social Services, or the commissioner's77 designee; and

78 (5) The State Ombudsman, or the State Ombudsman's designee.

79 (c) All initial appointments to the advisory council shall be made not 80 later than January 1, 2026. Advisory council members first appointed pursuant to subparagraphs (A) to (D), inclusive, of subdivision (1) of 81 82 subsection (b) of this section shall serve for a term of two years. 83 Advisory council members first appointed pursuant to subparagraphs (E) to (I), inclusive, of subdivision (1) of subsection (b) of this section 84 85 shall serve for a term of three years. Any subsequent advisory council 86 member appointed pursuant to subdivision (1) of subsection (b) of this 87 section shall serve for a term of two years, or until such member's 88 successor is appointed. If the Governor determines that no suitable 89 successor candidate exists to appoint to the advisory council, the 90 Governor may reappoint an existing advisory council member for one 91 two-year term.

92 (d) The Commissioner of Aging and Disability Services, or the 93 commissioner's designee, shall convene the first meeting of the advisory 94 council not later than thirty days after all advisory council members are 95 appointed. At such meeting, the members of the advisory council shall 96 select a chairperson and vice chairperson from among the members of 97 the advisory council. The chairperson and vice chairperson may serve 98 in such roles not more than two consecutive years. The advisory council 99 shall meet not less than once every calendar quarter.

(e) The Department of Aging and Disability Services' dementia
services coordinator shall serve as administrative staff to the advisory
council.

(f) Not later than January 1, 2027, the advisory council shall submit a
report on the State Alzheimer's Plan to the Governor and, in accordance
with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, the joint
standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of
matters relating to aging, public health and human services regarding
the State Alzheimer's Plan. Such report shall include recommendations

- 110 barriers to the implementation of such plan. The advisory council shall
- 111 update the State Alzheimer's plan every four years.
