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## AN ACT CONCERNING TEACHER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2025*) (a) As used in this section:

(1) "Eligible student" means any person who (A) has a cumulative
grade point average of at least a "B+" in high school, (B) is classified as
an in-state student pursuant to section 10a-29 of the general statutes, (C)
is making satisfactory academic progress while enrolled in a teacher
preparation program at a public institution of higher education, (D) has
completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, and (E) has
accepted all available financial aid; and

9 (2) "Financial aid" means the sum of all scholarships, grants and 10 federal, state and institutional aid received by a qualifying student. 11 "Financial aid" does not include any federal, state or private student 12 loans received by a qualifying student.

(b) Not later than January 1, 2026, the Department of Education shall
establish a tuition assistance program for eligible students who enroll in
a teacher preparation program at a public institution of higher
education in the state. The department shall pay not less than the
balance of tuition, after the acceptance of all available financial aid, for
such eligible student who (1) is approved for the tuition assistance

19 program, (2) enrolls at a public institution of higher education in a 20 teacher preparation program leading to a bachelor's or master's degree 21 for the fall semester of 2026, or any semester thereafter, and (3) agrees 22 to work as a teacher in a public school in the state for not less than five 23 years after completion of such teacher preparation program.

(c) On or before January 1, 2026, said department shall post in a conspicuous location on its Internet web site (1) a description of such tuition assistance program, and (2) the application form for such program. Not later than April 1, 2026, and annually thereafter, the department shall notify students in each public high school in the state about the tuition assistance program.

30 (d) For the fall semester of 2026, and each semester thereafter, the 31 Department of Education shall provide tuition assistance (1) to not more 32 than fifty eligible students each semester on a rolling basis, and (2) for 33 the first four academic years if an eligible student is enrolled in a 34 bachelor's degree program, or the first five academic years if an eligible 35 student is enrolled in an integrated bachelor's and master's degree 36 program, provided the eligible student meets and continues to meet the 37 requirements of this section. The department shall not use tuition 38 assistance to supplant any financial aid, including, but not limited to, 39 state or institutional aid, otherwise available to an eligible student.

(e) The Commissioner of Education shall develop tuition assistance
repayment criteria for recipients who do not complete the teacher
preparation program or five years of employment as a teacher in a
public school in the state. Any amounts repaid to the department shall
be deposited in the General Fund.

(f) Not later than January 1, 2027, and annually thereafter, the Department of Education shall submit, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to education a report on the tuition assistance program, including, but not limited to, (1) the number of eligible students enrolled 51 in the program, (2) the teacher preparation programs in which such 52 eligible students enrolled, and (3) for each cohort of eligible students, 53 the (A) average amount of tuition assistance provided, (B) completion 54 rates, and (C) employment placement upon graduation.

55 Sec. 2. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2025) (a) There is established a 56 scholarship program administered by the Talent Office of the 57 Department of Education to provide an annual scholarship to a teacher who is certified through an alternative route to certification. The 58 59 scholarship shall be available to any teacher who (1) completes an 60 alternative route to certification program, (2) is employed as a teacher 61 in the state, and (3) enrolls in a teacher preparation program at an 62 institution of higher education in the state leading to a master's degree 63 for the fall semester of 2026, or any semester thereafter. The scholarship 64 shall be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and in an amount 65 prescribed by the Talent Office.

66 (b) On or before January 1, 2026, said department shall post in a 67 conspicuous location on its Internet web site (1) a description of such 68 scholarship program, including, but not limited to, the amount of 69 scholarship available through such program, and (2) the application 70 form for such program.

(c) Not later than January 1, 2027, and annually thereafter, the Department of Education shall submit, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to education a report on the scholarship program, including, but not limited to, the number of scholarship recipients and the teacher certification program in which such teacher enrolled.

Sec. 3. (*Effective July 1, 2025*) The sum of five million dollars is
appropriated to the Department of Education from the General Fund,
for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, for the tuition assistance
program established pursuant to section 1 of this act.
