AN ACT CONVEYING A PARCEL OF STATE LAND IN THE TOWN OF BETHEL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Notwithstanding any provision
2 of the general statutes, the Commissioner of Administrative Services, on
3 behalf of the state agency having custody or control of the parcel, shall
4 convey to the Gayatri Corporation a parcel of land located in the town
5 of Bethel, for twenty-five thousand dollars, plus the administrative costs
6 of making such conveyance. Said parcel of land has an area of
7 approximately .4 acre and is identified as Lot 7 in Block 108 on town of
8 Bethel Tax Assessor's Map 59 and is further identified in a Certificate of
9 Condemnation of the State Highway Commissioner recorded in the
10 town of Bethel Land Records in Volume 66 at page 380. The conveyance
11 shall be subject to the approval of the State Properties Review Board.

12 (b) The State Properties Review Board shall complete its review of the
13 conveyance of said parcel of land not later than thirty days after it
14 receives a proposed agreement from the Department of Administrative
15 Services. The land shall remain under the care and control of the state

16 until a conveyance is made in accordance with the provisions of this
17 section. The State Treasurer shall execute and deliver any deed or
18 instrument necessary for a conveyance under this section. The
19 Commissioner of Administrative Services shall have the sole
20 responsibility for all other incidents of such conveyance.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To convey a parcel of state land in the town of Bethel to the Gayatri Corporation for twenty-five thousand dollars and administrative costs.
