## AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY EXPANDING SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE 2-1-1 INFOLINE PROGRAM OPERATED BY THE UNITED WAY OF CONNECTICUT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a task force
   to study expanding services provided by the 2-1-1 Infoline program
   operated by the United Way of Connecticut. Such study shall include,
- 4 but need not be limited to, state funding necessary to expand services of5 the program.
- 6 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- 7 (1) Two representatives of the United Way of Connecticut appointed8 by the speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 9 (2) Two representatives of advocacy organizations who serve clients
  10 who have benefited or may benefit from services provided by the 2-1-1
  11 Infoline program appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate;
- 12 (3) One appointed by the majority leader of the House of13 Representatives;

14 (4) One appointed by the majority leader of the Senate;

(5) One appointed by the minority leader of the House ofRepresentatives;

17 (6) One appointed by the minority leader of the Senate;

(7) A representative appointed by the Senate and House chairpersons
of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
cognizance of matters relating to human services;

(8) A representative appointed by the Senate and House ranking
members of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
having cognizance of matters relating to human services;

24 (9) The Commissioner of Social Services, or the commissioner's25 designee;

26 (10) The Commissioner of Housing, or the commissioner's designee;27 and

(11) The Commissioner of Early Childhood, or the commissioner'sdesignee.

30 (c) Any member of the task force appointed under subdivision (1),
31 (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7) or (8) of subsection (b) of this section may be a
32 member of the General Assembly.

(d) All initial appointments to the task force shall be made not later
than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall
be filled by the appointing authority.

(e) The speaker of the House of Representatives and the president pro
tempore of the Senate shall select the chairpersons of the task force from
among the members of the task force. Such chairpersons shall schedule
the first meeting of the task force, which shall be held not later than sixty
days after the effective date of this section.

(f) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the
General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to human
services shall serve as administrative staff of the task force.

(g) Not later than January 1, 2026, the task force shall submit a report
on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committees
of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
appropriations and human services, in accordance with the provisions
of section 11-4a of the general statutes. The task force shall terminate on
the date that it submits such report or January 1, 2026, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
