AN ACT PROHIBITING THE STATE FROM MANDATING EXPERIMENTAL OR EMERGENCY VACCINATIONS, DISCLOSURE OF VACCINATION STATUS OR TESTING FOR ILLNESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

That the general statutes be amended to prohibit the state, or any state employee, from mandating that an employee of the state, a nonprofit organization or another entity that receives funding from the state, (1) receive an experimental vaccine, a vaccine approved only for emergency use or that has not received full approval from the United States Food and Drug Administration, (2) disclose such employee's vaccination status, or (3) participate in mandatory testing for an illness.

Statement of Purpose:

To prohibit the state from mandating experimental or emergency vaccinations, disclosure of vaccination status or testing for an illness.
