AN ACT LIMITING RECOVERY OF CLAIMS FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CONDITIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

That title 38a of the general statutes be amended to prohibit any health insurer from seeking recovery from a behavioral health provider for overpayment of a claim under a health insurance policy to treat any behavioral health condition, unless notice is provided to such behavioral health provider not later than two years after the initial claim for payment was received by such health insurer.
