AN ACT REQUIRING NURSING HOMES AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES TO BE EQUIPPED WITH AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2025*) (a) As used in this section:

(1) "Assisted living facility" means a facility operated by an assisted
living services agency, as defined in section 19a-490 of the general
statutes, that provides chronic and stable individuals with services that
include, but need not be limited to, nursing services and assistance with
activities of daily living and may have a dementia special care unit or
program, as defined in section 19a-562 of the general statutes;

8 (2) "Automated external defibrillator" means a device that: (A) Is used 9 to administer an electric shock through the chest wall to the heart; (B) 10 contains internal decision-making electronics, microcomputers or 11 special software that allows it to interpret physiologic signals, make 12 medical diagnosis and, if necessary, apply therapy; (C) guides the user 13 through the process of using the device by audible or visual prompts; 14 and (D) does not require the user to employ any discretion or judgment

15 in its use; and

(3) "Nursing home" means (A) any chronic and convalescent nursing
home or any rest home with nursing supervision that provides nursing
supervision under a medical director twenty-four hours per day; or (B)
any chronic and convalescent nursing home that provides skilled
nursing care under medical supervision and direction to carry out
nonsurgical treatment and dietary procedures for chronic diseases,
convalescent stages, acute diseases or injuries.

23 (b) Not later than January 1, 2026, the administrator of each nursing 24 home and each assisted living facility shall (1) provide and maintain an 25 automated external defibrillator in a central location on the premises of 26 the home or facility, (2) make such central location known and accessible 27 to staff members and residents of the home or facility and family 28 members of such residents who visit the home or facility, (3) ensure that 29 at least one staff member of the home or facility, who is trained in 30 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automatic external 31 defibrillator in accordance with the standards set forth by the American 32 Red Cross or American Heart Association, is on the premises of the 33 home or facility during all hours of operation, and (4) maintain and test 34 automatic external defibrillator in accordance with the the 35 manufacturer's guidelines.
