RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE PROVISIONS OF THE TREATY OF HARTFORD OF 1638 THAT SOUGHT TO ERADICATE THE PEQUOT CULTURAL IDENTITY.

Resolved by this Assembly:

1 WHEREAS, the Treaty of Hartford was an agreement between the

2 English inhabitants in Connecticut and the Narragansett and Mohegan

3 Tribes entered into on September 21, 1638, to end the Pequot War; and

WHEREAS, said treaty sought to eradicate the Pequot cultural identity by prohibiting the Pequots from returning to their lands, abolishing their tribal name and forcing them to assimilate into the Mohegan and the Narragansett Tribes and the remaining members of the Pequot Tribe to be sold into slavery or killed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Connecticut General
Assembly pause in its deliberations to condemn the provisions of the
treaty authorizing the selling, murdering or maiming of a Native
American tribe and reiterate its support of the Native American tribes
in this state and our successful partnership with them.
