## "AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY OF COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS USED BY PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL AND ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY THE CONSOLIDATION OF PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINTS."

Strike section 2 in its entirety and substitute the following in lieu
 thereof:

3 "Sec. 2. (Effective from passage) (a) The Commissioner of Emergency 4 Services and Public Protection shall convene a working group within 5 the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection to study 6 the current system of public safety answering points and make 7 recommendations for consolidating such answering points while 8 prioritizing the need to ensure public safety. The working group shall 9 consider and make recommendations regarding: (1) The establishment 10 of state goals regarding consolidation, (2) the definition of "regional 11 public safety answering point", (3) any challenges to consolidation 12 presented by existing collective bargaining agreements, (4) issues that 13 may arise in municipalities that would no longer have an individual

14	physically located within the municipality to act as a dispatcher at all
15	times after consolidation, (5) time frames for consolidation, (6) where
16	and how to locate regional public safety answering points, (7) ways to
17	enhance the skills of telecommunicators, as defined in section 28-30 of
18	the general statutes, and personnel providing emergency medical
19	dispatch, as defined in section 28-25 of the general statutes, including
20	recommendations regarding training standards and performance
21	accountability, (8) the governance structure for regional public safety
22	answering points, and (9) any other related issues the working group
23	deems appropriate.

50 (c) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection
51 shall appoint the members described in subdivisions (1) to (10),
52 inclusive, of subsection (b) of this section.

(d) All initial appointments to the working group shall be made not
later than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy
shall be filled by the appointing authority.

(e) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection
shall select the chairpersons of the working group from among the
members of the working group. Such chairpersons shall schedule the
first meeting of the working group, which shall be held not later than
sixty days after the effective date of this section. Such chairpersons may
establish subcommittees of the members as needed and designate a
chairperson of each such subcommittee.

63 (f) The working group shall submit, in accordance with the 64 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing 65 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters 66 relating to public safety and security and planning and development: 67 (1) An interim report on the findings and recommendations of the 68 working group not later than February 1, 2026, and (2) a final report on 69 the findings and recommendations of the working group not later than 70 January 1, 2027. The working group shall terminate on the date that it 71 submits such final report or January 1, 2027, whichever is later."
