"AN ACT CONCERNING PROTECTIONS FOR ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE AND THE EQUITABLE DELIVERY OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN THE STATE."

1 Strike section 24 in its entirety and insert the following in lieu thereof:

"Sec. 24. Subsection (a) of section 19a-638 of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

5 (a) A certificate of need issued by the unit shall be required for:

- 6 (1) The establishment of a new health care facility;
- 7 (2) A transfer of ownership of a health care facility;
- 8 (3) A transfer of ownership of a large group practice to any entity

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9	other than a (A) physician, or (B) group of two or more physicians,
10	legally organized in a partnership, professional corporation or limited
11	liability company formed to render professional services and not
12	employed by or an affiliate of any hospital, medical foundation,
13	insurance company or other similar entity;
14	(4) The establishment of a freestanding emergency department;
15	(5) The termination of inpatient or outpatient services offered by a
16	hospital, including, but not limited to, the termination by a short-term
17	acute care general hospital or children's hospital of inpatient and
18	outpatient mental health and substance abuse services;
19 20 21	(6) The establishment of an outpatient surgical facility, as defined in section 19a-493b, or as established by a short-term acute care general hospital;
22	(7) The termination of surgical services by an outpatient surgical
23	facility, as defined in section 19a-493b, or a facility that provides
24	outpatient surgical services as part of the outpatient surgery department
25	of a short-term acute care general hospital, provided termination of
26	outpatient surgical services due to (A) insufficient patient volume, or (B)
27	the termination of any subspecialty surgical service, shall not require
28	certificate of need approval;
29 30	(8) The termination of an emergency department by a short-term acute care general hospital;
31 32	(9) The establishment of cardiac services, including inpatient and outpatient cardiac catheterization, interventional cardiology and

- 33 cardiovascular surgery;
- (10) The acquisition of computed tomography scanners, magnetic
 resonance imaging scanners, positron emission tomography scanners or
 positron emission tomography-computed tomography scanners, by any
 person, physician, provider, short-term acute care general hospital or
 children's hospital, except (A) as provided for in subdivision (22) of

39 subsection (b) of this section, and (B) a certificate of need issued by the 40 unit shall not be required where such scanner is a replacement for a 41 scanner that was previously acquired through certificate of need 42 approval or a certificate of need determination, including a replacement 43 scanner that has dual modalities or functionalities if the applicant 44 already offers similar imaging services for each of the scanner's 45 modalities or functionalities that will be utilized;

(11) The acquisition of nonhospital based linear accelerators, except a
certificate of need issued by the unit shall not be required where such
accelerator is a replacement for an accelerator that was previously
acquired through certificate of need approval or a certificate of need
determination;

51 (12) An increase in the licensed bed capacity of a health care facility, 52 except as provided in subdivision (23) of subsection (b) of this section;

53 (13) The acquisition of equipment utilizing technology that has not54 previously been utilized in the state;

55 (14) An increase of two or more operating rooms within any three-56 year period, commencing on and after October 1, 2010, by an outpatient 57 surgical facility, as defined in section 19a-493b, or by a short-term acute 58 care general hospital; [and]

(15) The termination of inpatient or outpatient services offered by a
hospital or other facility or institution operated by the state that
provides services that are eligible for reimbursement under Title XVIII
or XIX of the federal Social Security Act, 42 USC 301, as amended; and

(16) The establishment of an overdose prevention center through the
 pilot program established pursuant to section 23 of this act."
