"AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NET EQUALITY PROGRAM."

Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2025*) (a) As used in this section:

(1) "Affordable broadband Internet access service" means broadband
Internet access service that (A) costs not more than the amount
established in subsection (g) of this section, and (B) meets the minimum
speed requirements set forth in subsection (h) of this section;

8 (2) "Broadband Internet access service" has the same meaning as9 provided in section 16-330a of the general statutes;

(3) "Broadband Internet access service provider" has the same
meaning as provided in section 16-330a of the general statutes;

12 (4) "Eligible household" means a household (A) in which at least one

resident is an eligible individual, and (B) that is located within a
qualified broadband Internet access service provider's service territory
in this state;

(5) "Eligible individual" means an individual who is enrolled in aqualified public assistance program;

(6) "Person" means an individual, corporation, business trust, estate
trust, partnership, association, joint venture or any other legal or
commercial entity;

(7) "Qualified broadband Internet access service provider" means a
broadband Internet access service provider that is doing business in this
state and with any state agency, including, but not limited to, through a
procurement contract;

25 "Qualified public assistance program" (8)means (A) the 26 supplemental nutrition assistance program administered by the 27 Department of Social Services pursuant to the Food and Nutrition Act 28 of 2008, as amended from time to time, and (B) any public assistance 29 program recognized by a qualified broadband Internet access service 30 provider for the purpose of determining eligibility for the qualified broadband Internet access service provider's existing low-income 31 32 broadband Internet access service program; and

(9) "State agency" has the same meaning as provided in section 1-79
of the general statutes, but does not include the Department of
Emergency Services and Public Protection.

(b) Not later than September 30, 2026, the Commissioner of Energy
and Environmental Protection shall, for the purposes set forth in this
section, develop, establish and administer a program that shall be
known as the "Net Equality Program".

40 (c) As part of the program established pursuant to subsection (b) of

41 this section, and beginning on October 1, 2026, each qualified broadband

42 Internet access service provider shall allow any individual who resides

in an eligible household that is located within such qualified broadband
Internet access service provider's service territory in this state to submit
to such qualified broadband Internet access service provider a request
to subscribe to affordable broadband Internet access service provided
by such qualified broadband Internet access service provider.

(d) On and after October 1, 2026, each qualified broadband Internet
access service provider shall make a commercially reasonable effort to
raise public awareness regarding the availability of the affordable
broadband Internet access service such qualified broadband Internet
access service provider offers to eligible households located within such
qualified broadband Internet access service provider's service territory
in this state. Such effort shall include, but need not be limited to:

(1) Posting the enrollment procedures for such qualified broadband
Internet access service in a prominent and publicly accessible location
on such qualified broadband Internet access service provider's Internet
web site; and

59 (2) Including the enrollment procedures for such qualified 60 broadband Internet access service in any written and commercial 61 advertisement developed to inform individuals residing in eligible 62 households located within such qualified broadband Internet access 63 service provider's service territory in this state regarding such qualified 64 broadband Internet access service.

(e) Not later than February 1, 2027, and annually thereafter, each
qualified broadband Internet access service provider shall submit to the
Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, in a form and
manner prescribed by the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental
Protection, a report disclosing:

(1) The number of eligible households that signed up for affordable
broadband Internet access service provided by such qualified
broadband Internet access service provider during the year that is the
subject of the report; and

(2) The total number of eligible households that received affordable
broadband Internet access service provided by such qualified
broadband Internet access service provider during the year that is the
subject of such report.

(f) As part of the program established pursuant to subsection (b) of
this section, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection
shall explore options to establish and advance strategic and effective
public-private partnerships.

(g) (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection, the monthly cost, including all taxes, charges and fees, charged by a qualified broadband Internet access service provider to an eligible household for affordable broadband Internet access service provided pursuant to this section, including all equipment associated with such affordable broadband Internet access service, shall not exceed forty dollars.

89 (2) Not later than June 1, 2027, and annually thereafter, the 90 Department of Energy and Environmental Protection shall adjust the 91 maximum monthly cost that a qualified broadband Internet access 92 service provider may charge to an eligible household for affordable 93 broadband Internet access service provided pursuant to this section 94 during the twelve-month period beginning on July first of the same 95 calendar year in accordance with any change in the consumer price 96 index for the preceding calendar year, as published by the United States 97 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

98 (h) (1) Except as provided in subdivisions (2) and (3) of this 99 subsection, all affordable broadband Internet access service provided 100 pursuant to this section shall:

101 (A) During the period beginning October 1, 2026, and ending 102 September 30, 2027, provide speeds that are at least as fast as (i) one 103 hundred megabits per second downstream, and (ii) five megabits per 104 second upstream;

105	(B) On and after October 1, 2027, provide speeds that are at least as	
106	fast as (i) one hundred megabits per second downstream, and (ii) twenty	
107	megabits per second upstream; and	

108 (C) Speeds and latencies that are sufficient to support distance109 learning and telehealth services.

110 (2) Beginning on June 1, 2030, and not more frequently than 111 biennially thereafter, the Department of Energy and Environmental 112 Protection may, in consultation with the department's Bureau of Energy 113 and Technology and the Commission for Educational Technology, 114 increase the minimum speeds set forth in subparagraph (B) of 115 subdivision (1) of this subsection for the two-year period beginning on 116 July first of the same calendar year. The department, bureau and 117 commission shall post such increased speeds on the department's, 118 bureau's and commission's Internet web sites.

119 (3) The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection may 120 authorize a deviation from the requirements established in this 121 subsection for the purpose of complying with applicable state or federal 122 law, except the department shall not authorize any deviation from such 123 requirements to allow any affordable broadband Internet access service 124 provided pursuant to this section to provide speeds that are slower than 125 the speeds set forth in subparagraph (A) or (B) of subdivision (1) of this 126 subsection or established by the department, in consultation with the 127 department's Bureau of Energy and Technology and the Commission 128 for Educational Technology, pursuant to subdivision (2) of this 129 subsection, whichever speeds are faster.

(i) Beginning on January 31, 2027, any state agency proposing to enter
into a contract for the purchase of broadband Internet access service
shall, all other factors being equal, give preference to a qualified
broadband Internet access service provider that offers affordable
broadband Internet access service to eligible households pursuant to
this section.
