Substitute House Bill No. 7279

House of Representatives, May 27, 2025

The Committee on Government Oversight reported through REP. DATHAN of the 142nd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONVEYING A PARCEL OF STATE LAND TO THE TOWN OF BETHEL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) Notwithstanding any provision
2 of the general statutes, the Commissioner of Transportation shall convey
3 to the town of Bethel a parcel of land located in the town of Bethel, at a
4 cost equal to the fair market value of the property, as determined by the
5 average of the appraisals of two independent appraisers selected by the
6 commissioner, plus the administrative costs of making such
7 conveyance. Said parcel of land has an area of approximately .4 acre and
8 is identified as Lot 7 in Block 108 on town of Bethel Tax Assessor's Map
9 59 and is further identified in a Certificate of Condemnation of the State
10 Highway Commissioner recorded in the town of Bethel Land Records
11 in Volume 66 at page 380. The conveyance shall be subject to the
12 approval of the State Properties Review Board.

13 (b) The State Properties Review Board shall complete its review of the

14 conveyance of said parcel of land not later than thirty days after it
15 receives a proposed agreement from the Department of Transportation.
16 The land shall remain under the care and control of said department
17 until a conveyance is made in accordance with the provisions of this
18 section. The State Treasurer shall execute and deliver any deed or
19 instrument necessary for a conveyance under this section. The
20 Commissioner of Transportation shall have the sole responsibility for all
21 other incidents of such conveyance.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

In Subsec. (b), "the state" was changed to "said department" for consistency.

Explanation

The bill conveys a specified parcel of land, totaling 0.4 acres, from the Department of Transportation to the town of Bethel. The state would lose use of the asset and gain revenues equal to the fair market value of the property. The town of Bethel would gain use of an asset and would pay fair market value of the property and the administrative costs of the conveyance.

The land conveyance is subject to the review and approval of the State Properties Review Board.

The Out Years

The conveyance action is one time in nature. Control of the asset would continue into the future as described above, subject to future municipal decisions.
