Potential Savings

The amendment expands land that is not subject to the affordable housing appeals procedure to include boroughs that meet the criteria set forth for municipalities where at least ten per cent of the total number of dwelling units are affordable. This may result in a potential savings to municipalities associated with legal costs to the extent fewer appeals are submitted.^{1,2}
