The amendment strikes section 1 of the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact.

The amendment also strikes section 2 of the underlying bill and removes the associated cost of \$860,415 in FY 26 and \$110,415 in FY 27 to the Judicial Department and \$44,950 in both FY 26 and FY 27 to the State Comptroller for fringe benefits.

Finally, the amendment makes changes to section 5 of the underlying bill that result in a minimal potential revenue gain to the General Fund beginning in FY 26, by potentially limiting a fee waiver for criminal history records checks for security officer license renewals.

The amendment makes other conforming and technical changes that do not result in a fiscal impact.
