OFA Fiscal Note

The amendment strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact.

Section 1, which establishes a task force to study the reduction of single-use plastics in the state, does not result in a fiscal impact to the state or municipalities because the task force has the expertise to carry out these requirements.

Section 2 requires certain commercial and industrial entities to adopt a written policy pertaining to a food donation program that covers various requirements outlined under the amendment. This does not result in any fiscal impact.

Section 3 establishes a goal of allocating not less than 20% of funds available in the sustainable materials management account to municipalities with populations of up to 20,000. This results in a potential revenue gain to such municipalities.
