The amendment strikes section 24 and the associated fiscal impact. The amendment removes the language exempting the overdose prevention centers from requiring a certificate of need (CON) and instead expressly requires a CON for the purposes of establishing such centers. To the extent this delays or prevents the establishment of an overdose prevention center through the pilot, the amendment reduces the potential cost to DMHAS to implement or operate the pilot using non-state funds. Specifically requiring a CON could also result in a revenue gain associated with the CON application fee.
