The amendment strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact.

The amendment makes certain unpaid fines and penalties a lien on the affected real estate or real estate located in the municipality where the penalty is due. This may result in a potential revenue gain to municipalities beginning in FY 26 to the extent that additional liens are issued, and debt is collected.

The amendment also requires a municipality to provide written notice of the violation, unpaid penalties, fines, and fees by certified mail which may result in a minimal cost to municipalities beginning in FY 26 to provide the notice.¹
