## **Explanation**

The amendment strikes the underlying bill and results in the fiscal impact described below. The amendment makes a variety of changes to the state's campaign finance laws resulting in the fiscal impacts outlined below.

The amendment creates a variety of changes related to State Elections Enforcement Commission (SEEC) oversight, which requires an

additional staff member<sup>2</sup> to meet the requirements of the amendment at a cost to SEEC of \$84,555<sup>3</sup> in FY 26 and \$82,055 in FY 27, and a fringe cost of \$33,405 in FY 26 and FY 27. The additional position will offset the expanded administrative and oversight role of the SEEC.

In addition, these sections reduce the reasons for SEEC to disqualify a contribution resulting in a potential increased cost to the resources of the Citizens' Election Fund. The exact impact depends on the number of candidates who received Citizens' election Program funding who previously would not have qualified.

The remaining sections of the amendment make a variety of changes that result in no fiscal impact to the state or municipalities.
