"AN ACT CONCERNING WORKFORCE SHORTAGES, WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING."

- Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following in lieu thereof:
- 3 "Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The University of Connecticut
- 4 shall study and make recommendations regarding strategies to support
- 5 and encourage student enrollment at The University of Connecticut,
- 6 Waterbury Campus. Such study shall include, but need not be limited
- 7 to, a plan offering dual enrollment programs and online course offerings
- 8 and consideration of (1) the operation of such programs and course
- 9 offerings, and (2) workforce development initiatives at said campus.

SB 1259 Amendment

10 (b) Not later than February 1, 2026, The University of Connecticut 11 shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations to the joint 12 standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of 13 matters relating to commerce and higher education and employment 14 advancement in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the 15 general statutes."
