**"AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE  
STATE DISPARITY STUDY."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2025*) Notwithstanding the  
4 provisions of sections 46a-82, 46a-100 and 46a-101 of the general  
5 statutes, any person claiming to be aggrieved by an alleged  
6 discriminatory practice, as defined in section 46a-51 of the general  
7 statutes, may file a complaint with the Superior Court in lieu of filing a  
8 complaint with the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities  
9 in accordance with the provisions of section 46a-82 of the general  
10 statutes. The court may grant the complainant such legal and equitable  
11 relief which it deems appropriate, including, but not limited to,  
12 temporary or permanent injunctive relief, punitive damages, attorney's  
13 fees and court costs."
