AN ACT CONCERNING STAGGERED TERMS FOR MEMBERS OF THE TWO-GENERATIONAL ADVISORY BOARD

SUMMARY: By law, the Two-Generational Advisory Board advises the state on how to foster family economic self-sufficiency in low-income households through a comprehensive two-generational service delivery approach. The board consists primarily of appointed members who, under prior law, served terms of an unspecified duration. Beginning July 1, 2025, the act (1) sets three-year terms for appointed board members and (2) requires them to be appointed or reappointed by the appointing authorities such that no more than one-third of their terms end on the same date. To implement these requirements, the act sets term expiration dates for current and future board members with some current members potentially having terms longer than three years to establish a staggered expiration pattern, then all future terms are three years. The act sets the expiration dates as follows:

- 1. for members appointed before June 30, 2022, terms end June 30, 2026;
- 2. for members appointed on or after June 30, 2022, but before July 1, 2025, terms end June 30, 2028; and
- 3. for members appointed on or after July 1, 2025, terms end three years after the member's appointment date.

Existing law requires the board's membership to include representatives of nonprofit and philanthropic organizations and scholars with expertise in twogenerational programs and policies; however, prior law did not designate an appointing authority for these members. Under the act, these members must be selected by the Commission on Women, Children, Seniors, Equity and Opportunity.
