Explanation

The bill expands what is considered plumbing and piping work resulting in a potential revenue gain to the General Fund to the extent additional plumbing and piping licenses are applied for¹.

The bill also changes the licensing period from one to two years for professional engineers and land surveyors and doubles the licensing fee which is revenue neutral over the biennium.

Additionally, the bill makes various changes to consumer protection statutes which result in no fiscal impact to the state.

The Out Years

The annualized ongoing fiscal impact identified above would continue into the future subject to the number of plumbing and piping
